ACTION PROGRESS COMMENTS:

Perceptions of public safety in public areas were most recently measure in the Annual Community Survey 2015. The results were:

- The perception of safety in public areas of Nillumbik during the day increased very marginally from 88.9 per cent to 89.1 and was marginally higher than both the northern region and the metropolitan Melbourne average recorded in the 2013 Governing Melbourne.
- The perception of safety in public areas of Nillumbik at night was rated at 75 per cent, up marginally from 74.1 and measurably higher than metro. Melbourne (71.1).
- The perception of safety in and around activity centres in Nillumbik was rated at 80 per cent, almost identical to the metro Melbourne average (81 per cent) recorded in Governing Melbourne.
- The perception of safety traveling on trains in Nillumbik was rated at 71.4 per cent, marginally but not significantly lower than the metro Melbourne average (7.30) recorded in the 2013 Governing Melbourne.

The next Annual Community Survey will be conducted in late 2016/early 2017 and will be reported to Council in 2017.

For the 2016 year, 714 preschool registrations were received and accepted. All children received a place within a Nillumbik preschool.

Council centrally manages four-year old preschool registrations for 17 preschools in Nillumbik which operate from Council-owned or managed buildings. Council collects applications, allocates a preschool place and liaises with families in relation to their four-year old preschool registration. Applications are accepted from the first business day in March, two years before a child is eligible to attend preschool and close no later than 30 June in the year before attendance to be included in first round offers.

ACTION PROGRESS COMMENTS:

The most recent Annual Community Survey was undertaken in December 2015 and January 2016 by Metropolis Research. This was the fifth Annual Community Survey Council had commissioned Metropolis to undertake on its behalf.

Satisfaction with access to community services was 78.1 per cent in 2016, a decline on the 80.8 per cent recorded in 2015. This level of satisfaction is categorised as 'excellent', the same as in 2015.

Satisfaction with the 10 included services and facilities can best be summarised as:

- 'excellent' for local libraries, service for children from birth to five years of age, education and learning, environmental programs and facilities, sports ovals, and arts and cultural events and programs.
- 'very good' for on and off road bike paths, aquatic and leisure centres, and service for youth.
- 'good' for services for seniors and persons with a disability.

Food safety regulation should protect public health by preventing the sale and consumption of unsafe food. A total of 26 inspections of registered food businesses resulted in a major or critical non-compliance outcome with the Food Act during the first quarter. 100 per cent of these non-compliances received a follow up inspection to ensure the business reached a compliant outcome. Due to the time required to complete the necessary rectifications, 22 non-compliant businesses (85 per cent) received a followed up inspection within the same quarter, with the remaining four non-compliant businesses (15 per cent) receiving a follow up inspection in the subsequent quarter.

ACTION PROGRESS COMMENTS:

The Hurstbridge Community Hub is currently at 60 per cent capacity with over 12,000 participants attending up to June 2016. Fifteen permanent user groups regularly utilise the Hub and casual users are increasing.

Partnerships are forming between user groups, cross referrals and event planning providing a strong foundation for integration and collaboration between users, council and the community.

The Hub Community Interest Group are volunteers representing the community to ensure the needs and aspirations of the broader community are considered. Links have been established between the Hub and St Andrews (Wadambuk) Community Centre committee members to develop opportunities to work together.

In addition a new project has commenced on the Place Activation of the Northern Corridor, with a focus on the towns of Hurstbridge, St Andrews and Panton Hill. Planning for this project is well underway and an internal mapping exercise involving the identification of past and future works will help inform a more integrated approach to council deliverables and community engagement in the future.

ACTION PROGRESS COMMENTS:

The community bus program has developed stronger links with the Eltham Senior Citizens Club. This in turn has enabled social connectivity for a number of club members who would otherwise be isolated with no transport. Volunteer drivers were provided with wheelchair hoist training in order to better accommodate passengers with disability. The importance of this service is surmised by a letter of appreciation from one resident who described community bus as enabling her to 'keep in touch with life'.

The medical transport program enables many Nillumbik residents who are geographically and socially isolated to get to medical appointments. Half of the medical transport trips were to the Austin and Repatriation Hospitals. Stronger links have been forged with the Austin who recently issued the organisation with free parking passes for volunteer drivers which will reduce Council's parking costs. A couple of those passengers to the Austin were attending for chemotherapy and/or radiation treatment, and the medical transport filled gaps in personal transport rosters with those passengers' family and friends. Likewise, the medical transport program was able to transport its first baby passenger whose mother needed assistance in transport to the Royal Children's Hospital.

The community bus provided 315 passenger trips and medical transport provided 68. With 383 trips in total, many volunteer hours have been contributed in order to provide such a strong program. Volunteer drivers regularly provide feedback as to their enjoyment of their volunteer role, helping the passengers, talking with the passengers and learning more about local history.

ACTION PROGRESS COMMENTS:

The most recent Annual Community Survey was undertaken in December 2015 and January 2016 by Metropolis Research. This was the fifth Annual Community Survey Council had commissioned Metropolis to undertake on its behalf.

Satisfaction with Council's performance meetings its responsibilities to the environment declined 1.9 per cent in 2016 to 75.6 per cent, although it remains at a level categorised as 'very good'. Despite this decline, satisfaction with this aspect of governance and leadership has increased seven per cent since 2011.

The result is marginally higher than the 2015 metropolitan Melbourne average of 73.5 per cent and measurably and significantly higher than the northern region average of 70.7 per cent.

The next Annual Community Survey will be undertaken in late 2016/early 2017 and reported to Council in March or April 2017.

The project involves investigating stormwater treatment and reuse options within the Diamond Creek Catchment from Eltham North to the Yarra River. A draft report has been received from ENGENY Water Management and is currently being reviewed by staff for site suitability and funding.

Four WSUD assets have been audited by Alluvium on behalf of Melbourne Water. Council is awaiting the report which will inform future maintenance requirements. A second round of asset audit will commence early in 2017.

Rainwater tanks with a capacity of 10,600 litres have been installed at Eltham Community and Reception Centre as part of the renovation project.

In April 2016 Teska Carson commenced marketing for the purchase and development of 44 Graysharps Road and closed on Thursday 12 May 2016 at 2pm.

A number of Liveable Nillumbik Community bulletins with project updates and questions and answers have been distributed throughout the Shire.

A Councillor workshop was held in August 2016 followed by a report to Council in September 2016 outlining the evaluation panel's recommendations. In September 2016 Council endorsed the evaluation panel's recommendation that two developers be selected to progress to Stage 2- Request for Proposal process. Both proponents have been advised in writing that they are successful and have commenced work on their Stage 2 RFP phase submission.

In conjunction with the Liveable Nillumbik project, Council is preparing a draft Precinct Masterplan. This involves identifying opportunities and constraints within the precinct. To date three stakeholder workshops (walking tours) have been conducted with key stakeholders and user groups within Hurstbridge. Additional workshops were to be scheduled with the Hurstbridge Traders Association and other interested community members who have registered their interest. Information will be provided to the developer to inform design opportunities. A draft precinct plan will then be presented to Council.

Work on the specifications for Stage 2 – Request for Proposal is well progressed and are Council has obtained legal and probity advice which has guided the design of both the EOI and RFP process.

It is anticipated that the Stage 2 RFP will be formally provided to the shortlisted developers in December 2016 and will close in late February 2017.
